We are located on the lobby level of The Goldsmith Jewish Federation Center.

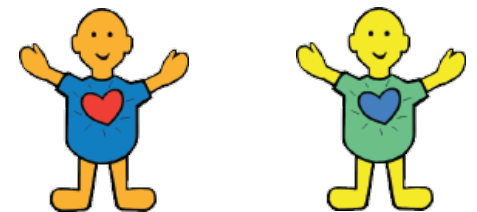
Free parking is available in the visitor's lot just west of the building.
